Loudon and Monroe area Students Awarded Four Year Scholarships

At recent high school awards ceremonies, the Community Church at Tellico Village awarded a 4-year scholarship valued at \$7,000 to the following local students:

- Alexia Angelos, Lenoir City High School: Alexia plans to attend the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and major in Biology.
- Brooklynn Nicole Herold, Greenback High School Brooklyn plans to attend Western Carolina University and major in Chemistry/Pre-Dental.
- Aaron Lay, Sequoyah High School: Aaron plans to attend Tennessee Tech University and major in Agriculture Communications.
- Lizabeth Simmons, Loudon High School: Lizabeth plans to attend Johnson University and major in Intercultural Studies.

Members of the church's Mission/Scholarship team interview students from each school and chose the individuals based upon their GPA, school and community activity and need.

With these recent awards, the Community Church at Tellico Village, since 1992, has provided 113 scholarships, valued over \$525,000 to students living in Loudon and Monroe counties.

Each student is assigned a mentor by the church's Scholarship Team, they stay in touch with the students and provide encouragement and any assistance that may be required during the term of the scholarship. Each year the Church hosts all active students in the scholarship program to discuss their life and educational status with the congregation during Scholarship Sunday service, it was held on June 24th.

Melanie Shepard, Greenback Guidance Counselor: "We are thankful for the Community Church at Tellico Village and those who donated to make this scholarship program possible. The committee does an excellent job in screening all the qualified candidates and making sure they pick someone who is in need yet deserves the scholarship money. Some may view it just as a donation, but to me, it is CCTV making an investment for a better future."
