

TCF ADDS THREE BOARD MEMBERS

The Tellico Community Foundation (TCF), an affiliated fund of East Tennessee Foundation (ETF), added three new members to its Advisory Board. The new members are: Bill Baxter, Joan Mulliner and Cathy Nyberg.

Members of TCF Advisory Board are elected to three-year terms. The Board consists of nine members from the Tellico Village community and the surrounding area. They identify needs, raise funds and advise on grant-making activities.

Baxter is a ten-year resident of Tellico Village, having moved to the community from New Jersey after a long career with Johnson & Johnson. He is a past president of the New Villagers Club of Tellico Village and has been involved with the Tellico Village HomeOwners Association as a Board representative and co-chair of the membership committee. He's a community tour guide introducing prospective residents to the Village by doing land and lake tours.

Mulliner came to Tellico Village in 2006 from Maryland after retiring from her own trade show exhibition design firm. Her community involvement includes leading the fundraising efforts for the Tellico Village Kahite Women's Organization that provides financial and volunteer support for many Monroe County not for profit organizations. Mulliner supports MACA by organizing various fundraising activities and is on the Operating Board of the Kahite EMR Group.

A former resident of Savannah, GA, Nyberg came to Tellico Village in 2016. During her professional life, she worked in software sales/relationship management with institutional money managers. Since arriving in the Village, Nyberg has served as the treasurer for the Friends of the Tellico Village Library and presently volunteers at Good Samaritan and is membership coordinator for Lady Linksters.

TCF recently awarded Our Place one-acre to build an adult day center from the parcel it owns at the corner of Rt. 444 and Rt. 72 opposite the Food Lion. The remaining commercially zoned acreage is for sale with the proceeds intended for TCF's grant-making and endowment funds.
